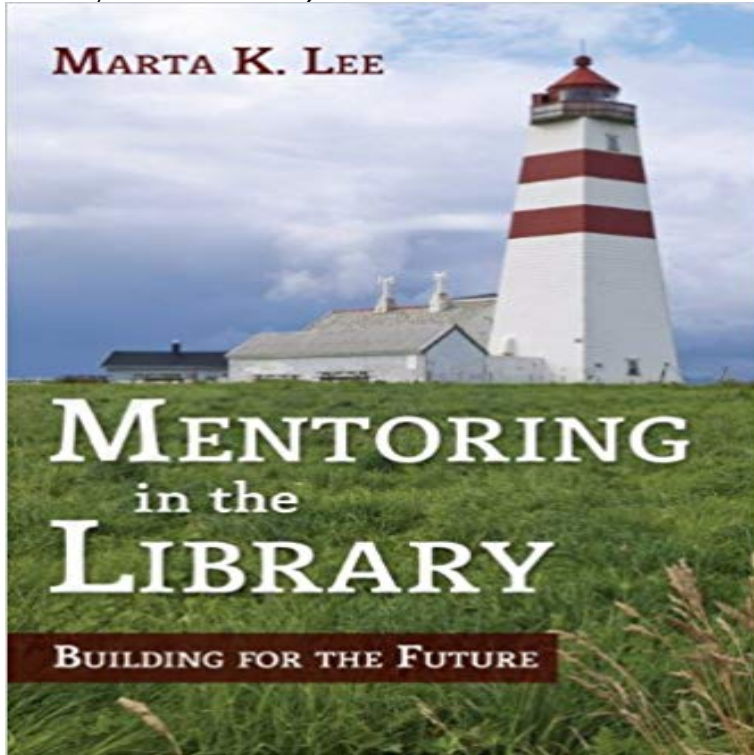


Mentoring in the Library: Building for the Future (ALA Guides for the Busy Librarian)
